



INTRODUCTION TO THE VAST LANDSCAPE OF CANADIAN SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DOMESTIC STUDENTS

Scholarships in Canada can be broadly classified into the following categories:



Merit-based Scholarships: Awarded to students who have demonstrated exceptional academic, athletic, or artistic achievements.

TD Scholarships for Community Leadership

Schulich Leader Scholarships are based on academic excellence, leadership, and financial need. The deadline for applications varies depending on the nomination process of each high school.

When applying for these popular Canadian scholarships, make sure to research their specific requirements, gather the necessary documents, and submit your application before the respective deadlines. By staying organized and proactive, you can increase your chances of securing financial aid for your education.

PROVINCE-BY-PROVINCE BREAKDOWN OF SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

BRITISH COLUMBIA

Federal and Provincial Governments

<u>Canada Student Grants</u>

The Canada Student Grants program is designed to provide non-repayable financial assistance to students with demonstrated financial need. <u>District/Authority Scholarships</u>

The District/Authority Scholarships are merit-based scholarships offered by school districts and independent school authorities in British Columbia. These scholarships are intended to recognize high school graduates who excel in specific areas, such as fine arts, applied skills, physical activity, international languages, community service, or technical and trades training. Each scholarship is valued at \$1,250, and the number of scholarships available varies by district or authority. To apply, students must contact their school's scholarship coordinator for information on the application process and deadlines.

BC Access Grant

The BC Access Grant is a needs-based grant aimed at assisting low- and middle-income students enrolled in full-time undergraduate studies at eligible institutions in British Columbia. The grant amount varies depending on the student's financial need, family income, and the length of their study program. To apply for the BC Access Grant, students must complete the StudentAid BC application, which will automatically assess their eligibility for this grant and other provincial financial aid programs.

• Indigenous Student Awards

○ Indspire:

As a national Indigenous-led charity, Indspire offers a variety of scholarships, bursaries, and awards for First Nations, Inuit, and Métis students across Canada. Award amounts and eligibility criteria vary by program.

• University of British Columbia (UBC) Presidential Scholars Award

UBC offers several Presidential Scholars Awards to exceptional high school students entering their first year of undergraduate studies. Scholarships are granted based on academic excellence, leadership, and involvement in extracurricular activities. Students are assessed for the Presidential Scholars Award using the information provided in both the Academic Profile and Personal Profile sections of their online application.

• Simon Fraser University (SFU) Scholarships and Awards

SFU provides a variety of scholarships and awards to outstanding high school students entering their first year of study. Scholarships include the Gilhooley Family Entrance Bursary in Business, valued at \$40,000, and the Fairfax Entrance Bursary, valued at \$30,000. These awards recognize academic excellence, leadership, and community involvement. To apply, students must submit an online application for admission and a separate scholarship application. [1][2]

• British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT) Entrance Awards

BCIT offers numerous entrance awards to high school students entering full-time diploma or degree programs at the institute. Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships

Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) Grants

Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships and Bursaries

<u>New Brunswick Tuition Bursary</u>

Designed for students from low-income families, this bursary provides up to \$3,000 per academic year for eligible students attending a publicly funded post-secondary institution in New Brunswick. To apply, students must submit a Student Financial Services application and meet specific eligibility requirements.

New Brunswick Opportunities Fund

The New Brunswick Opportunities Fund (NBOF) is a financial support program offered by the Government of New Brunswick. It aims to help eligible residents access post-secondary education and training by providing non-repayable grants to cover tuition fees and other related expenses. The NBOF targets individuals who face barriers to pursuing their education, such as low income, disabilities, or those who are unemployed or underemployed. To be eligible for the NBOF, applicants must be residents of New Brunswick, demonstrate financial need, and be enrolled in an approved program at a designated post-secondary institution, among other requirements.

The amount of funding provided is determined on a case-by-case basis and depends on individual circumstances. To apply for the NBOF, applicants must submit an application through the New Brunswick Student Financial Services website, along with supporting documentation as required.

BursariesCégep Entrance Scholarships

These scholarships are open to all first-year students, both domestic and international, who will be enrolled full-time in one of the college's programs. The scholarships aim to support students financially and encourage academic success. To apply, students must complete the online application form available on the Cégep de la Gaspésie et des Îles website and submit it along with the required documents. The application deadline and scholarship amounts are not specified in the article; you should visit the college's website or contact them directly for more details. In addition to entrance scholarships, the college offers various other financial aid options, such as loans and bursaries, work-study programs, and emergency financial assistance.

Colleges and Universities Scholarships

• McGill University Scholarships

McGill University offers a variety of entrance scholarships for incoming undergraduate students to recognize and support academic excellence and achievements. These scholarships are divided into two categories: One-year Entrance Scholarships and Major Entrance Scholarships. Oneyear Entrance Scholarships are awarded based on academic merit, with a minimum value of \$3,000 for one academic year. • Concordia University Scholarships

Concordia University offers entrance scholarships to exceptional incoming undergraduate students based on academic merit. • Université Laval Scholarships

The Université Laval provides a directory of various scholarships and bursaries available to students, including admission scholarships. These financial awards aim to support and encourage students in their academic pursuits. Scholarships are offered by the university, government, foundations, and private donors. Eligibility criteria, application processes, and scholarship amounts vary depending on the specific award. Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships:

<u>Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship</u>

The Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship (SAS) is a financial aid program offered by the Government of Saskatchewan to help eligible students pursuing post-secondary education in the province. The scholarship provides up to \$500 per academic year (maximum \$2,000 over four years) to students who have recently graduated from a Saskatchewan high school and are enrolled in full-time studies at an approved post-secondary institution in Saskatchewan. Eligibility is determined based on the student's residency, high school completion, and enrollment in an approved program. The scholarship is automatically applied to the tuition fees of eligible students upon confirmation of enrollment by their post-secondary institution.

• <u>Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) Scholarships</u>

The Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) Scholarships are an initiative by the provincial government to encourage high school students to explore careers in skilled trades. <u>University of Saskatchewan Entrance Scholarships</u>

The University of Saskatchewan offers numerous scholarships, bursaries, and awards to help students fund their education. Scholarships are meritbased and awarded for academic achievements, while bursaries are needbased and granted on the basis of financial need. Awards typically recognize specific accomplishments or qualities in a student. To apply, students need to create an account on the university's Scholarship and Bursary Portal. Incoming high school students are automatically considered for some awards upon applying for admission. It is important to check the application deadlines and requirements for each opportunity to maximize chances of receiving funding.

• University of Regina Entrance Scholarships

The University of Regina offers a variety of entrance scholarships for undergraduate students entering directly from high school to an undergraduate degree program. These scholarships aim to support academic excellence and provide financial assistance to deserving students. One of the prominent scholarships is the UR Circle of Scholars Entrance Scholarship. This scholarship offers \$20,000 (\$5,000 x 4 years) for top international students and up to 10 awards for top domestic students in identified regions within Canada. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must apply for early admission by March 15 and have a minimum early admission average of 90%. To maintain the scholarship, recipients must register and remain registered in a minimum of 9 credit hours per term and achieve a minimum sessional GPA of 80% on at least 24 credit hours to renew the scholarship for up to three additional years.

In addition to the UR Circle of Scholars Entrance Scholarship, the University of Regina also offers entrance scholarships based on early admission averages. Students with an early admission average of 95% or higher can receive \$3,000, while those with an average of 93-94.99% can receive \$1,500, and students with an average of 90-92.99% are eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship. To be considered for these scholarships, students must apply for early admission by March 15 and be domestic students completing high school at the time of admission. To retain any of these entrance scholarships, students must register and remain registered in a minimum of 9 credit hours at the University of Regina throughout the Fall term, up to and including the last day of classes. This ensures that students continue to meet the necessary requirements and maintain their academic performance to be eligible for scholarship renewal.



Colleges and Universities Scholarships:

<u>Saskatchewan Polytechnic Entrance Scholarships</u>

Saskatchewan Polytechnic offers a variety of scholarships and awards for its students to support their education and recognize their achievements. These opportunities include entrance awards, program-specific awards, and awards based on academic performance, community involvement, or financial need. Students can apply for these scholarships and awards through the Saskatchewan Polytechnic Scholarships and Awards online application system. The application deadlines vary depending on the award, with some opportunities available throughout the year.

• First Nations University of Canada Scholarships

The First Nations University of Canada offers various scholarships, awards, and bursaries to support and recognize the achievements of its students. These funding opportunities cater to different areas such as academic excellence, leadership, community involvement, and financial need. The university provides awards for both Indigenous and non-Indigenous students, with some awards specifically designed for Indigenous students. Students can apply for these scholarships, awards, and bursaries through the online application system.

• St. Thomas More College Scholarships

St. Thomas More College offers various student awards to support and recognize students' achievements. The awards are categorized into scholarships, bursaries, and prizes. While the specific scholarships offered may change from year to year, the following are some examples of the types of scholarships available:

O **Entrance Scholarships:** These scholarships are awarded to incoming students based on their academic performance in high school. Criteria may include grade averages, specific course achievements, or other accomplishments.

○ **Continuing Scholarships**: These scholarships are designed for current St. Thomas More College students who have demonstrated strong academic performance during their studies at the college. Awards may be based on cumulative GPA, faculty recommendations, or involvement in extracurricular activities.

• St. Thomas More College Scholarships

O **Leadership Scholarships:** These awards recognize students who have shown exceptional leadership skills and community involvement while attending St. Thomas More College. Criteria may include participation in student government, volunteer work, or other extracurricular activities that demonstrate a commitment to making a positive impact on the community.

O **Departmental Scholarships:** Some scholarships are specifically designed for students pursuing particular fields of study within St. Thomas More College. These awards may be based on academic performance within the specific department or other accomplishments related to the field of study.

Corporations and Businesses Scholarships:

<u>Nutrien Indigenous Youth Financial Management Awards</u>

Despite the numerous opportunities and resources available for those interested in this career path, few Indigenous youth pursue financial management education after completing high school. To address this issue, AFOA Canada partnered with Nutrien to create the Annual Nutrien Indigenous Youth Financial Management Awards. Winners of these awards gain the opportunity to attend AFOA Canada's National Conference and participate in a tailored Youth program that introduces them to careers in Indigenous finance and management. Additionally, recipients become eligible for a scholarship worth up to \$5,000.

<u>Conexus Credit Union Scholarships</u>

The Conexus Youth Leadership Award recognizes and rewards high school students in Saskatchewan who demonstrate exceptional leadership qualities, academic performance, and commitment to their communities. The award aims to support students as they pursue post-secondary education and develop into future leaders. Each year, Conexus awards ten \$1,500 scholarships to deserving students across the province. Applicants must be Saskatchewan residents, enrolled in grade 12, and planning to attend a post-secondary institution in the province. Applications are evaluated based on community involvement, leadership skills, and academic achievements.

Non-profit Organizations and Foundations Scholarships:

<u>The Saskatchewan School Boards Association Education Scholarships</u>

The Saskatchewan School Boards Association (SSBA) offers Education Scholarships to support and encourage students pursuing a career in education. Each year, SSBA awards two scholarships worth \$2,500 each to students entering their first year of post-secondary education in an education program at a Saskatchewan institution. Applicants must be graduating from a Saskatchewan high school and demonstrate academic excellence, leadership skills, and commitment to their communities. The selection process considers factors such as community involvement, extracurricular activities, and an essay outlining the applicant's interest in pursuing a career in education.

Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships:

<u>Nova Scotia Student Assistance</u>

The Nova Scotia Student Assistance program offers loans and grants for full-time studies, with a single application covering both provincial and federal funding. The basic criteria are the same for both types of funding, while some grants have additional criteria for specific groups of students. Grants do not need to be repaid, but loans must be repaid starting six months after leaving school, at which point they also begin to accumulate interest.

• Nova Scotia Power Scholarships

Nova Scotia Power, in partnership with the provincial government, offers several scholarships to support post-secondary students in the province. These scholarships aim to promote education and employment opportunities for youth in Nova Scotia, particularly those pursuing careers in fields related to the energy industry. Some of the scholarships provided by Nova Scotia Power include:

○ African Nova Scotian Emerging Leaders: This scholarship aims to support African Nova Scotian students who demonstrate strong leadership skills, academic excellence, and community involvement. It is awarded to students pursuing post-secondary education in any field of study at a recognized university or college.

O **Mi'kmaq Bursary:** This bursary is designed to provide financial assistance to Mi'kmaq students attending a recognized university or college in Nova Scotia. The bursary supports students pursuing post-secondary education in any field of study, with a focus on those who demonstrate financial need, academic achievement, and community involvement.

O Nova Scotia Power Family Scholarship: This scholarship is available to children of Nova Scotia Power employees and retirees. It recognizes students who excel academically, display strong leadership skills, and are actively involved in their communities. The scholarship supports students pursuing post-secondary education in any field of study at a recognized university or college.

Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships:

○ Women in Trades, Engineering & Technology: This scholarship is dedicated to supporting women pursuing careers in trades, engineering, and technology fields. It is awarded to female students attending a recognized university or college in Nova Scotia and enrolled in an eligible program related to trades, engineering, or technology. The scholarship aims to encourage more women to enter these traditionally male-dominated fields and promote gender diversity within the industry.

To be considered for a Nova Scotia Power scholarship, applicants must demonstrate strong academic performance, leadership skills, and community involvement. Additionally, they must be residents of Nova Scotia and enrolled in a full-time post-secondary program.

Colleges and Universities Scholarships:

Dalhousie University Entrance Scholarships

Dalhousie University allocates millions of dollars annually to scholarships and bursaries for incoming students, with over 2,000 entrance awards available through the General Entrance Award application. Entrance awards and scholarships target high school students applying directly to Dalhousie or those who haven't completed any transferable post-secondary studies. To be considered for most entrance awards and bursaries, candidates must complete the General Entrance Award application. Selection is based on factors such as academic performance, leadership, extracurricular activities, community service, financial need, and cultural identity. Note that some awards require separate applications.Eligibility typically requires a minimum 80% admission average or 26 predicted/anticipated IB Diploma points. The average is calculated using the five courses required for the student's chosen program. Both domestic and international students can apply. For First Nations and Indigenous Black Student Scholarships, the admissions average is not considered.

• Saint Mary's University Entrance Scholarships

Saint Mary's University offers over \$15.7 million in scholarships, bursaries, and awards annually to support incoming students. These financial aids recognize academic excellence, leadership, community involvement, and other achievements and are available for both domestic and international students. Students with an admission average of 85% or higher are automatically considered for Renewable Entrance Scholarships if they apply and are admitted to the university by March 1. In addition to these scholarships, Saint Mary's also offers Admissions Awards such as Presidential and Santamarian scholarships, which require a completed undergraduate application and acceptance by March 1. Scholarship eligibility criteria vary and may include community involvement, extracurricular activities, academic achievement, or financial need. The application deadline for Admissions Awards is March 1. Some scholarships, such as the Presidential/Presidential International Baccalaureate/Santamarian Scholarships and Sobey National Innovator Scholarships, require additional application materials, including essays, resumes, and letters of recommendation. These scholarships have specific renewal requirements based on maintaining a certain GPA. Other awards, like the Harrison McCain Scholarship/Bursary, Techsploration Science Award, The Bahamas Ministry of Education / Saint Mary's University Scholarship, and David Wang Scholarship, require separate applications and have unique eligibility criteria.

Colleges and Universities Scholarships:

• St. Francis Xavier University Entrance Scholarships

Applicants with an average of 85% or higher are considered for entrance scholarships. There are various scholarships available, ranging from \$5,000 to \$80,000, based on the applicant's average, program, and other eligibility criteria such as leadership, community service, and financial need. Some scholarships are renewable for up to four years. Major and application-based scholarships require submission of Grade 12 transcripts by March 1. Additional scholarships are available specifically for Nova Scotia residents, with varying eligibility requirements and award values.

For all scholarships, final value is based on five Grade 12 courses used to meet admission requirements for the respective program.

• Acadia University Entrance Scholarships

Acadia University offers entrance scholarships to Canadian and international students applying for undergraduate programs. Scholarships range from \$4,500 to \$10,000 over four years, with additional scholarships valued up to \$60,000. To apply, submit your admission application and required documentation. Eligible students will receive an initial scholarship offer in their acceptance letter. Local and specialized scholarships require separate application forms.

• <u>Cape Breton University Entrance Scholarships</u>

Cape Breton University offers Major Entrance Scholarships ranging from \$10,000 to \$30,000, with yearly amounts between \$2,500 and \$7,500. Additional entrance scholarships and bursaries are available, with values from \$500 to \$5,000 per year. Academic In-Course Scholarships are awarded after each Fall and Winter semester based on credit hours and a minimum average of 80%. Bursaries are available for students with financial need, including Entrance Bursaries for incoming students, which require an application and income tax documentation.

Mount Saint Vincent University Entrance Scholarships

Entrance scholarships at Mount Saint Vincent University are automatically considered for qualified applicants who submit a complete application for admission by March 1. High school graduates within one year of graduation and who have not attended a post-secondary institution are eligible. The scholarship average is calculated using the applicant's top five Grade 12 academic grades, including English. If there are not enough Grade 12 grades, top Grade 11 academic grades are used. One percentage point is added to the average for each IB, AP, or advanced level course. There are numerous entrance scholarships available, such as the 125th Anniversary Mount Saint Vincent Alumni Association Entrance Scholarship, Aramark Canada Ltd. Scholarship, Beacon Securities Endowed Scholarship, Beta Sigma Phi Endowed Scholarship, and many more. These scholarships cater to various fields of study, backgrounds, and interests, and aim to support students in their pursuit of higher education.

High school applicants with an average of 80% or more who apply before March 1 are eligible for various scholarships at Mount Saint Vincent University. These scholarships are awarded based on factors such as academic achievement, community involvement, leadership qualities, and financial need. Some scholarships require supplemental documentation, including resumes, letters demonstrating financial need, and statements of community involvement. Deadlines for application materials vary, but most are due by March 1. A limited number of prestigious President's Scholarships are also available to top applicants who demonstrate high academic achievement and contributions to their school or community.

Colleges and Universities Scholarships:

Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) Entrance Scholarships

Nova Scotia Community College (NSCC) offers over \$3 million in scholarships, bursaries, and awards annually to support students. These financial aids are available through the NSCC Foundation, student associations, and generous donors. Awards may be specific to a campus, program, or year of study and are open to both new and returning students. Criteria for these awards include financial need, leadership, volunteer experience, career interests, and academic

standing. Types of financial supports available at NSCC include high school entrance awards, scholarships, bursaries and awards, Sponsor-a-Student awards, urgent aid, and the African Canadian Emergency Fund. High school entrance awards cover first-year tuition costs for outstanding students entering certificate or diploma programs directly from a Nova Scotia high school. Current students and confirmed applicants can apply for awards through the Student Awards Portal, while prospective students can apply for select awards before applying to NSCC. The majority of awards are offered during the spring and fall award cycles, with eligibility depending on when a student's program begins.

• The Community Foundation of Nova Scotia (CFNS) Scholarships

The Community Foundation of Nova Scotia (CFNS) offers a variety of scholarships for high school students, recognizing their academic achievements, community involvement, and leadership skills. Each scholarship has its own eligibility criteria and application requirements. Some of the scholarships provided by CFNS include:

Non-profit Organizations and Foundations Scholarships:

• The Nova Scotia 4-H Council Scholarships

The Nova Scotia 4-H Council provides scholarships to recognize the achievements of 4-H members and support their pursuit of higher education. These scholarships are awarded based on academic performance, 4-H involvement, and community service. Applicants must be current or past members of the Nova Scotia 4-H program and plan to enroll in a full-time post-secondary program.

• The Nova Scotia Talent Trust Scholarships

The Nova Scotia Talent Trust offers scholarships to support students pursuing studies in the arts, including music, dance, theatre, visual arts, and film. These scholarships are awarded based on artistic talent, potential for success, and financial need. The Anne-Marie Woods/Imani Enterprises African Diaspora Travel Scholarship, for instance, awards \$1000 to disadvantaged Black youth (ages 18-35) based in Nova Scotia for presenting, teaching, performing, or professional development in Spoken Word or Theatre Arts. Eligible applicants must be residents of Nova Scotia and planning to enroll in a full-time post-secondary arts program.

<u>The Black Educators Association of Nova Scotia Scholarships</u>

The Black Educators Association of Nova Scotia provides scholarships to support African Nova Scotian high school students pursuing post-secondary education. These scholarships are awarded based on academic achievement, community involvement, and financial need. Applicants must be residents of Nova Scotia, identify as African Nova Scotian, and plan to enroll in a full-time post-secondary program.

Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships:

• <u>George Coles Bursary</u>

The Province of Prince Edward Island offers the George Coles Bursary (GCB) to help Island students with post-secondary expenses such as tuition, books, fees, and living expenses. The non-repayable bursary is automatically awarded to eligible students attending a publicly funded post-secondary institution in PEI, including the University of Prince Edward Island, Holland College, Maritime Christian College, and Collège de l'Île. To be eligible, students must be PEI residents, Canadian citizens, or permanent residents, enrolled full-time in their first degree, diploma, or certificate program, and not have previously received the bursary for the same year of standing. The amount awarded varies based on the institution attended, from \$2,600 annually at UPEI and Maritime Christian College up to a maximum of \$10,400, to varying amounts at Holland College or Collège de l'Île based on individual tuition costs.

The bursary is divided into up to four yearly payments corresponding to the student's year of standing. Students do not need to apply for the bursary, as Student Financial Services works directly with PEI's public post-secondary institutions to determine eligibility. However, students are responsible for ensuring their information is correct on their applications and student accounts. The bursary is credited to the student's school account, and any credit balance can be used for future tuition and fee payments or requested as a refund.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND



Federal and Provincial Government Scholarships:

• Island Skills Awards

The Island Skills Award is a financial assistance program for eligible Island students enrolled full-time in a post-secondary degree, diploma, or certificate program at Holland College or Collège Acadie î.-P.-É for at least 24 continuous weeks. The award provides \$1,000 in each student's first, second, and third year of study. There is no application process, as the school determines eligibility and automatically posts the award to the student's account in January of the current academic year. To be eligible, students must meet specific criteria, including being a resident of PEI, not receiving financial support from third-party agencies or government departments, and providing their Social Insurance Number. The Island Skills Award aims to recognize the value of post-secondary education, invest in Island students, encourage them to continue their studies in Prince Edward Island, and promote the development of publicly funded post-secondary institutions in the region. Students who believe they are eligible but have not received the award can submit an appeal form by August 31 of their eligible year. Payments are issued directly to the post-secondary institution by Student Financial Services, Department of Innovation and Advanced Learning.

Colleges and Universities Scholarships:

• <u>University of Prince Edward Island (UPEI) Entrance Scholarships</u>

Besides the primary Entrance Award Cycle at UPEI, there are substantial awards funded by donors that necessitate distinct applications and may require supplementary documents like personal statements or recommendation letters. These scholarships have deadlines on March 1 and May 1, such as Harrison McCain Scholarships, Joyce Family Foundation Renewable Awards, and E. Marion and Donald N. MacKenzie Entrance Scholarship in Nursing. Incoming high school students at UPEI are automatically evaluated for Guaranteed Entrance Scholarships upon submitting their university application.



Colleges and Universities Scholarships:

• Holland College Entrance Scholarships

All Holland College applicants and students can apply for scholarships, bursaries, and awards, with over \$500,000 available annually. To apply for an entrance award, students need an active Holland College application. To apply, sign in using your personal email address and complete the general application. You will be automatically matched to awards based on your application and student data. Additional award opportunities may require more information.

• <u>Collège de l'Île Entrance Scholarships</u>

Collège de l'Île offers various entrance scholarships to its students each year, including a \$1,000 scholarship for a student from each high school in Prince Edward Island. Additional scholarships are available for adult students returning to studies, students from outside PEI, and those enrolled in specific programs. Eligibility for some scholarships varies based on the place of residence, and applicants must be accepted into a full-time program at the college level without funding from other sources.

Potential candidates are notified about the availability of these scholarships at least two weeks before the deadline. A selection committee reviews the responses provided on the application form and may conduct short interviews with the candidates to determine the recipients of the scholarships.



Corporations and Businesses Scholarships:

• PEI Credit Unions Scholarships

Provincial Credit Union is dedicated to supporting local youth in their postsecondary education by offering 22 scholarships in four categories for grade 12 students on Prince Edward Island planning to attend a recognized postsecondary institution in the fall of 2023. The scholarships include Building Your Community, Community Leadership, Classic, and Loyal 2 Local, ranging from \$500 to \$2,000 each. To be eligible, applicants or their parents/legal guardians must be members of Provincial Credit Union for at least six months, and they must plan to attend a recognized university or college for the 2023-2024 school year. Students can apply for multiple scholarships by completing the online application form for each scholarship they wish to apply for, but only one scholarship will be awarded per individual.

Non-profit Organizations and Foundations Scholarships:

• PEI 4-H Council Scholarships

4-H PEI Annual Scholarships have been created to support 4-H members who aim to pursue higher education. Each year, 4-H PEI offers various scholarships for both Grade 12 graduates and students currently enrolled in or returning to a recognized post-secondary institution.

Scholarship Opportunities:

- Provincial 4-H Council Scholarship: One \$1,000 scholarship for a 4-H member in good standing, graduating from a recognized Island school during the scholarship year.
- 4-H PEI Alumni Scholarship: One \$1,000 scholarship for a 4-H member in good standing, graduating from a recognized Island school during the scholarship year.
- Cavendish Agri Services PEI 4-H Trust Scholarships: Two \$1,000 scholarships for Grade 12 students, two \$1,000 scholarships for students currently enrolled in or returning to post-secondary education in the fall of 2023, and one \$1,000 scholarship for either a Grade 12 student or a student enrolled in or returning to postsecondary education in the fall of 2023.



Non-profit Organizations and Foundations Scholarships:

• <u>PEI Roadrunners Club Scholarships (for students involved in the</u> running community)

The PEI Roadrunners Club offers scholarships to high school students in Prince Edward Island who are actively involved in the running community. These scholarships are designed to support students pursuing postsecondary education and recognize their dedication to the sport of running and commitment to a healthy lifestyle. The club offers two \$200 bursaries, named in memory of Jacob Simmons. Eligible applicants must be graduating from a PEI high school, enrolling in college or university in the fall, and have participated in running events during grade 12.
